**Music Bowl — Get Ready and Get Set for the Music Bowl 2017!!**

*Calling all students: Come one, come all to the Music Bowl!*

*Have fun and win prizes for answering questions about music theory and history. All are welcome!*

The Music Bowl is held every year at PMTNM's state conference. Music students of all levels enjoy using their music theory knowledge to win prizes in this fun contest.

Contest questions are based on material that appears in the primer level book and books 1-5 of the Keith Snell theory book series. The game is divided into varying levels of difficulty based on the levels of the participating students.

The game may include:

- Treble and bass clef note identification
- Clapping and counting rhythms of quarter notes and eighth notes
- Major and minor key signatures up to 4 sharps or flats
- Spelling triads that appear in the above keys
- Clapping and counting rhythms that include sixteenth notes
- Biographical information about composers such as where they were born and whether they belong to the baroque, classical, romantic or modern period
- Various musical terms such as *subito*, *a tempo*, etc.

## NEWS UPDATE on TREASURED SENIOR MEMBERS—

In response to requests for news of members who have retired from active roles in our organization, we include here both some sad news of a death and some happy news from one former member still going strong at age 93.

**First**—a tribute to **Eunice Schumpert**, 50-plus year member and former holder of numerous state offices for PMTNM and well-loved voice and piano teacher in Portales.

Eunice, who was a long-time member of Professional Music Teachers of New Mexico and friend of music, passed away in early March. Eunice was a devoted, stalwart member of PMTNM, whose elegant enthusiasm for the organization and its central purpose, educating future generations of musicians and musical audiences, will be sorely missed.

Born in the Lingo community south of Dora, NM, her family moved to Borger, Texas until Eunice was in sixth grade. There, she and her brother began to obtain recognition for their musical talent. After her mother's death, the family moved to Artesia, NM, where she graduated from high school.

Eunice's life-long interest in music caught the attention of Dr. Floyd Golden (former president of ENMU), who made a special visit to see her perform "Danny Boy". Dr. Golden was to become her scholarship donor at ENMC (now ENMU) where she majored in voice and piano. She met her husband, Billy, there and following their 1940 marriage, she devoted her life to teaching the divine language of music to her piano and voice students.

Eunice enjoyed being a member of numerous organizations, among them: First Baptist Church where she served as chair of the music committee. She served as an organist for over 40 years. She was also a member of the PEO Sisterhood-Chapter BE and served as the first president, Beta Sigma Phi, Master Chapter; Music Teacher's National Association-receiving her 50-year award in 2007, member of the Professional Music Teacher's of New Mexico (PMTNM). Offices held and awards received included: state secretary 1959 & 1960, vice president 1965-1968, certification chair person for 9 years, honors competition chairperson until 2002, district vice president until 2005), awarded life membership in 1993, received Teacher of the Year award for New Mexico in 1994, and received the National Association of Teachers of Singing 50-year award. She was also honored as the Pioneer of the Year of Roosevelt County in 2008.

**Next**—A note from Gillian McHugh, now a semi-retired, former member says,

*"I have a small musical family of six, which includes a young man of remarkable talent, such a delight. I am fortunate to be able to continue my work because I am a real medical muddle and have to rely on my "walker" to get around. I am grateful, though, to have as interesting a life as I do at the age of 93."* Gillian was named a *Santa Fe Living Treasure* several years ago. She is one of those who helped build PMTNM and keep it lively for many years. In 1997 Gillian was named PMTNM's Teacher of the Year. (Gillian's husband, John, was a noted architect who designed the first two Santa Fe Opera houses, the Inn on the Alameda and many other notable structures.)

**In Memoriam** - - With great sadness, we share with you the news of the passing of member Marta Dee in early July. Marta re-located to Albuquerque from California nearly ten years ago and became active in the Albuquerque chapter, especially as a member of the AMTA Book Group. Recently she had suffered from health difficulties. We extend our most sincere condolences to Marta's family. **Introducing A New Member** — Lori Dawkins, from Clovis, New Mexico, recently re-opened her piano studio after teaching elementary music in the public schools for several years. She taught music and group piano keyboard lessons for 13 years at Mesa Elementary School, earning her Master's Degree in Music from Colorado State University in 2011.

In 2016, Lori decided to resign from school teaching in order to devote more time to her piano studio and worship leader/pianist ministry at her church. Recently, she has had the privilege of teaching an Elementary Music Methods Class at ENMU, where she has had the opportunity to teach music education students what she learned from teaching music in the schools.

In addition to teaching and playing the piano, Lori enjoys gardening, reading, yoga, and spending time with her family and friends. She is excited to be teaching piano in a private studio again, with all different ages and levels of students.



